- 851,968 related user jobs (592,501 PHA)

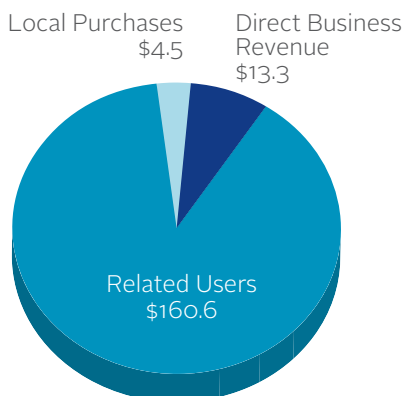

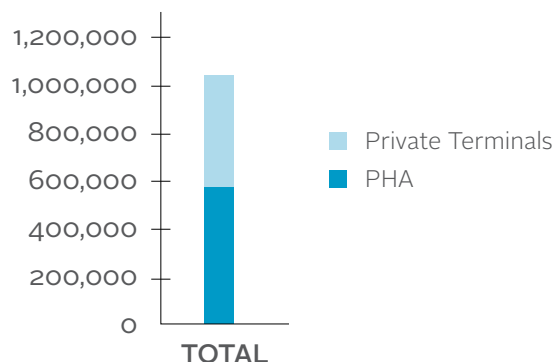

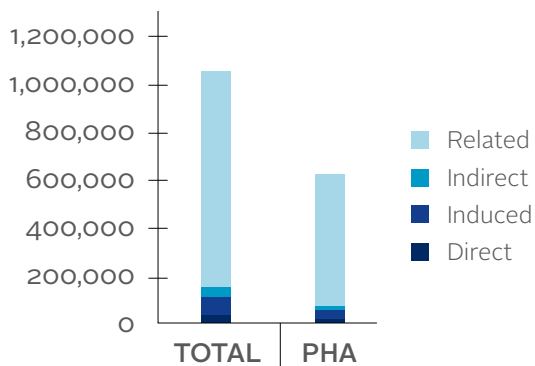
The Port Activity Supported \$178.5 Billion of State-Wide Economic Activity in 2011

SUMMARY OF JOB CATEGORIES

Direct Jobs

Those jobs with local firms providing support services to the seaport. Seaport direct jobs include jobs with railroads and trucking companies moving cargo to and from the PHA's marine terminals and private terminals, members of the International Longshoremen's Association (ILA) and non-ILA dockworkers, steamship agents, freight forwarders, ship chandlers, warehouse operators, bankers, lawyers, terminal operators, and stevedores.

Induced Jobs

Jobs created locally and throughout the regional economy due to purchases of goods and services by those directly employed.

Examples of these jobs are with grocery stores, the local construction industry, retail stores, health care providers, local transportation services, local and state government agencies providing public services and education to those directly employed, and businesses providing professional and business services in support of those directly employed.

Indirect Jobs

Jobs generated in the local economy as the result of local purchases by the firms directly dependent upon seaport. Some examples of these jobs include jobs in local office supply firms, equipment and parts suppliers, maintenance and repair services, insurance companies, consulting and other business services.

Related Jobs

Related jobs are jobs that are determined to be related to physical cargo that is exported and imported via the Port of Houston public and private marine terminals in 2011. These jobs include the portion of jobs at importing and exporting firms that are directly associated with the cargo moved via the Port of Houston marine terminals.

These jobs are also with importers of steel, producers and consumers of containerized cargo and breakbulk cargo, producers and consumers of the liquid and dry bulk cargoes moving through the public and private marine terminals and farmers producing grain and rice for export.
